

Summary: Arizona Project WILD 1990 -- Survey of Use

Additional participants evaluated in Arizona to create statistical sample to National Survey

Project WILD workshop participants: 73% used Project WILD; of those who didn't, 50% planned to use it in the future.

Non-users reported that their job does not provide an opportunity to use Project WILD materials.

Over 50% said they did at least 7 Project WILD activities per year.

84% of participants stated they had either greatly or moderately increased the time spent teaching about wildlife because of Project WILD.

70% of teachers felt that over 75% of their students had acquired a greater awareness of wildlife and the environment as a result of their experiences with Project WILD.

69% felt that over 75% of their students had acquired a greater knowledge of wildlife and the environment.

63% felt that over 75% of their students had acquired more responsible attitudes toward wildlife and the environment.

79% agreed that Project WILD provides a balanced and fair approach to the study of wildlife and environmental issues. (99% strongly or moderately agreed.)

78% strongly agreed that the Project WILD workshop was one of their most valuable sources of support for teaching about wildlife and the environment.

79% shared their Project WILD guide with other educators. 50% with at least 5 other educators.

71% said additional workshops would be very helpful.

75% said additional supplementary materials would be helpful.

60% said correlations to state curriculum guidelines would be helpful.
